

# COVID-19 SYMPTOMS/EXPOSURE - TTUSD'S ON CAMPUS HEALTH PROTOCOLS & NOTIFICATION PROCESS

To ensure the safety of our entire TTUSD community, it is essential that all staff, parents and students conduct a symptoms and COVID-19 check each day before leaving their home and arriving at school. In order for classes, cohorts and schools to remain safe and open, it is important that everyone follows this procedure daily before interacting with others.

**If a student or staff member has any of the following symptoms, they should not come to campus:**

- New or worsening cough
- Congestion or runny nose
- Aches/Chills
- Extreme fatigue
- Moderate/Severe sore throat
- Moderate/Severe headache
- Loss of smell and taste
- Diarrhea, nausea or vomiting
- Shortness of breath (unrelated to panic or anxiety)

NOTE: Schools will not be taking temperatures of any student upon arrival. It is the parents responsibility to conduct the symptoms check on their child. If someone in your household tested positive for COVID-19 or is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, you should not come to campus. If a student or staff member has had direct contact for a cumulative total of fifteen minutes or more over a 24-hour period with an individual who has tested positive for COVID within the last 14 days, you should not come to campus and stay home.

**Established Protocols if a student becomes ill while on campus:**

**If a temperature of 100.4 degrees + is detected**

If a student develops a fever while at school, they will be isolated from other students and parent/guardian will be contacted to pick them up. Sick students and staff will be advised to isolate according to CDC guidelines including 24 hours fever-free (without fever reducing medicines and 10 days since symptoms first appeared (20 days for more severe illness) and symptoms are improving.

**Measures that will be taken when a student, teacher, or staff member has symptoms, is in contact with someone infected or is diagnosed with COVID-19:**

TTUSD is following the steps and process as outline by the California Department of Public Health:

If a student/staff member has symptoms, they will be sent home with a recommendation to be tested. The school/classroom remains open until a case is confirmed positive.

If the student/staff member is tested and the results are negative, the student/staff member can return to work three days after symptoms resolve.
